There were lines of attendees from 7 AM to well after the afternoon air show started each day. In our building alone, over 40 stations were open for attendees to purchase wristbands and get information about the convention. Across Celebration Way, the On-Line registration building faced similar crowds. Final figures may be announced later this week, but it appears that attendance was greater than last year. According to EAA Chairman Jack Pelton, "We're very, very pleased. Attendance is up, camping is up, Tuesday we had to shut down general aviation parking for the first time, I think, since 2007. Some of the exhibitors had the best Monday they've had in a long time."

Saturday night, 10 Chapter members met and staked out a piece of ground in front of the IAC Headquarters Building to watch the evening Air Show and fireworks. A perfect night to watch a spectacular show with a few thousand fellow aviators.

Our next Young Eagle rally will be in Kenosha. It has been awhile since ENW has had a Young Eagle rally, and we expect this will be the renewal of regular rallies in the future. Sign-up have been limited to 36 for this first event. As usual, a half hour ground school will precede each Young Eagle's flight experience.

We are always looking for a few good ground volunteers to learn the ropes on staging an event. It seems we keep seeing the same few faces at each rally. While we have a really good crew, a few more volunteers would give some of our

regular crew a break. In particular, we are looking for people to greet and sign-in participants, teach the ground school (how airplanes fly), operate the computer to print certificates and photos, promote EAA to parents, assign students to pilots, and other activities. We have 2 Rallies left this year. You are welcome to come out and find out what it is all about. With a little training, you can become part of the Young Eagle team!

I also need to add we need additional pilots. Several new pilots joined our ranks this year, but more are needed. If interested, come out to the rally, or talk to Dan Feldman for details.

Congratulations go out to Rick Hansen, who took home Grand Champion at Oshkosh this year with his spectacular Hatz. Many of you saw this aircraft on the Hangar tour earlier this year. Some also heard what makes this aircraft special (considering this is the third Hatz Rick has built). We will be inviting Rick to a future meeting so that he can tell us about his fascination with all things Hatz and homebuilding.

Whether it is looking for lost cattle or improving crop yield, aviation has been associated with agriculture since it's earliest days. Crop dusting has played a major role in spreading insecticides, weed control, and fertilizers. The aircraft pictured here takes the functionality of these workhorses of agriculture one step further. Now organic fertilizer can be distributed quickly and evenly from the air. Developed by inventor Lowell Davis, of Carthage, Missouri, the "Crapduster" first took flight in 1997. This unique aircraft is currently on display in Lowell's home town, along with many other creations of his fertile mind.

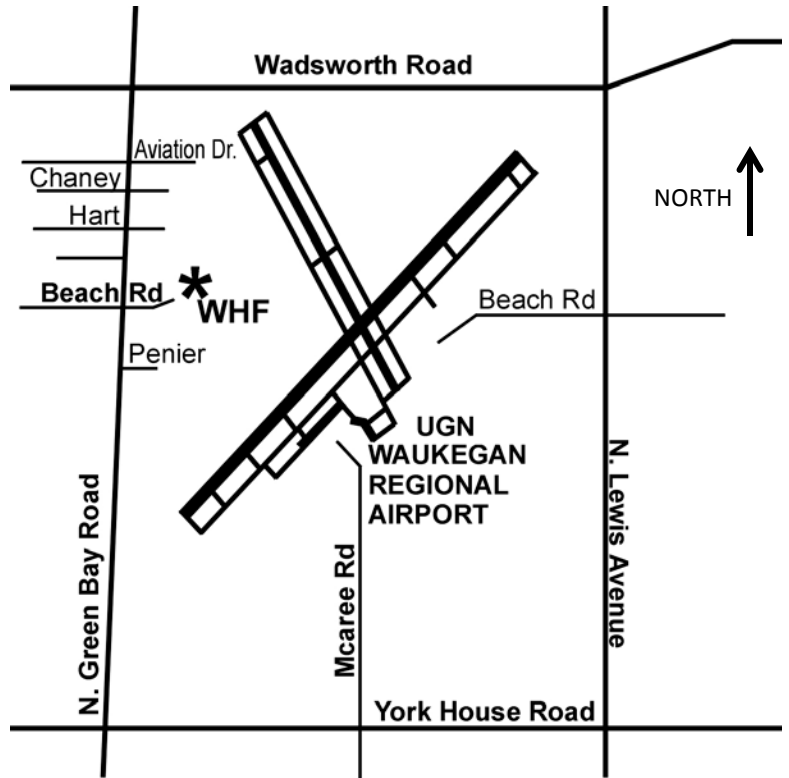
