Monthly meetings are held at the Warbird Heritage Foundation on the second Thursday of the month. Meetings start at 7:00 PM. The foundation is located on the west side to Waukegan airport. To get there, take Green Bay Road to Beach Road. Then take Beach Road east, where it turns into Corporate Drive. Do not take Beach Road from Lewis Avenue, as Beach is interrupted by runways.

Once past the gate, the meeting will be in the building on the right (closest to the taxiway). Gate opens about 15 minutes prior to meeting.

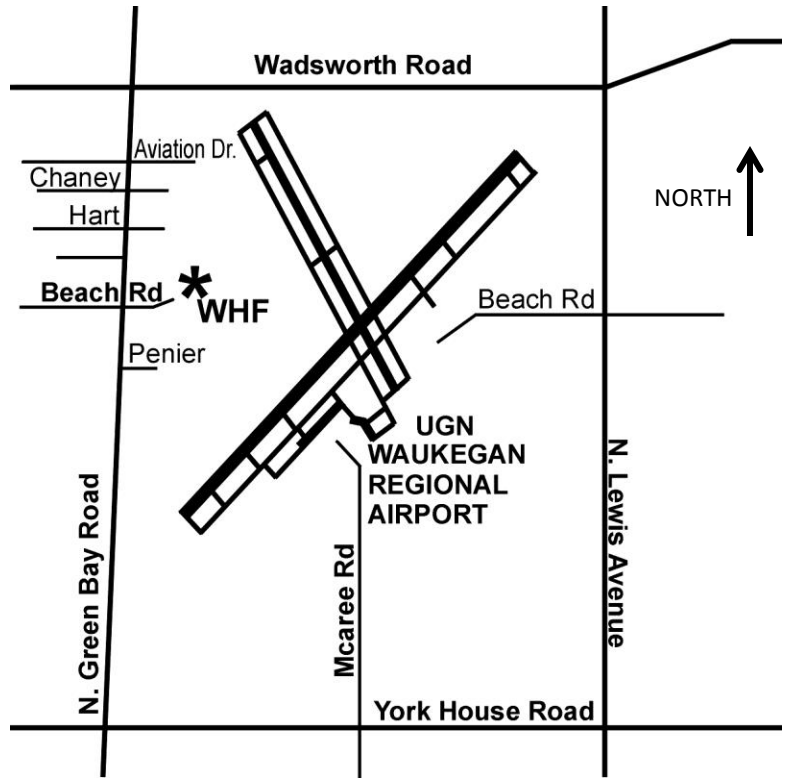
